# State Performance Plan Annual Performance Report

The reauthorized *Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA*), signed on December 3, 2004, became PL 108-446. In accordance with 20 U.S.C. 1416(b)(1), not later than one year after the date of enactment of the reauthorized *IDEA*, each state is required to have in place a performance plan evaluating the state's implementation of Part B and describing how the state will improve such implementation. This plan is called the <u>Part B State Performance Plan (SPP)</u> and is required to be posted on the state's web site.

Search:

In accordance with 20 U.S.C. 1416(2)(C)(ii) each state shall report annually to the Secretary of Education on its performance according to its SPP targets. This report is called the Part B Annual Performance Report (APR).
